

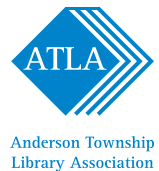
SUPPORT YOUR PUBLIC LIBRARY

WELCOME TO YOUR LIBRARY

The Public Library of Cincinnati and Hamilton County has one library card and 41 locations to serve you. Our mission is to connect people with the world of ideas and information. We excel in customer service, anticipate and meet changing needs, assure equal access to resources and services, and are a dynamic force in the community.

LIBRARY CARDS

Library cards are free to all Ohio residents. Cards are also free to residents of Boone, Campbell, and Kenton Counties in Kentucky with a valid library card from their local library, picture ID, and address verification. You can apply online for a library card at CincinnatiLibrary.org.

INTERNET ACCESS

Free wireless Internet access is available in the seating areas of all our branches and the Main Library. Free access to the Internet is available at all locations on more than 750 computer stations.

LOAN PERIODS

- New release films..... 4 days
- All other DVDs..... 7 days
- All other materials..... 21 days
- Digital materials may vary.

LIMITS

- Downloadable songs per week..... 7
- New release feature film DVDs..... 10
- All other materials..... No limit

RETURNS AND RENEWALS

Items may be returned to any location. All items may be renewed in person, at CincinnatiLibrary.org, or by calling (513) 369-6900. Materials are subject to varying renewal limits.

HOLDS

A library cardholder may place a hold on currently unavailable items. Holds may not be placed on reference materials. A maximum of 100 items may be placed on hold. Once the hold request is filled, items will be held at branches for 5 days before returning to circulation.

FINES

- Materials for children & teens..... 5¢ a day
- All other materials..... 20¢ a day

Sundays and closed holidays are included in the fine calculations. When unpaid fines and charges on overdue materials reach \$10, no additional items may be checked out. Charges for damaged materials will be assessed on an individual basis. Lost materials must be paid for in full.

EDUCATION & HOMEWORK SUPPORT

The Library offers online and in-person homework help at most branch libraries. The Main Library features the William Hueneke Homework Center for adults and children. Early Learning Stations and AfterSchool Edge computers are available at branch libraries. CincinnatiLibrary.org offers a number of eLearning and education support options. The Library also offers adults the opportunity to earn accredited high school diplomas and career certification through Career Online High School. MEETING ROOMS

Meeting rooms are available at many locations for use by groups and individuals who meet the guidelines. To reserve a room, visit CincinnatiLibrary.org.
