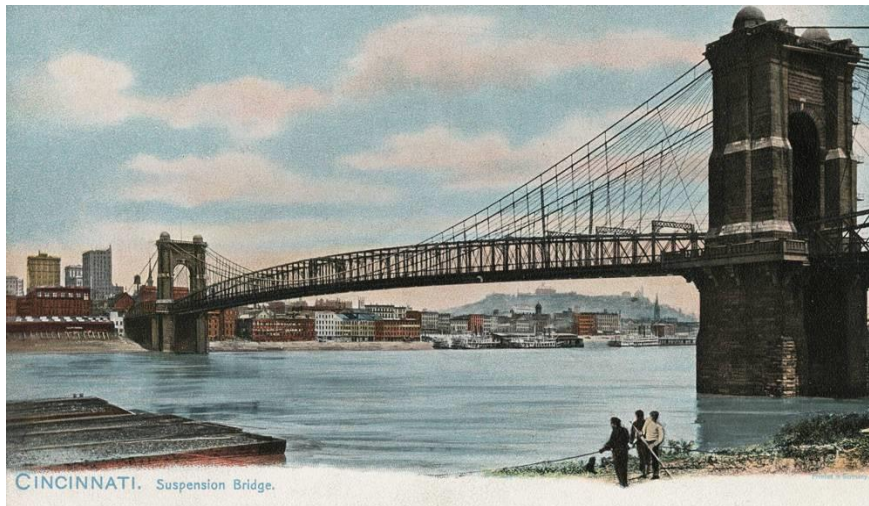

What: *A Dream Come True, a Song Well Sung: The John A. Roebling Suspension Bridge at 150* exhibit

Where: The [Joseph S. Stern, Jr. Cincinnati Room](#), third floor of the Main Library

Why: A treasure of this region, the Roebling Suspension bridge was completed at the end of the Civil War by master bridge builders John A. Roebling and his son, Washington A. Roebling, later famous for the Brooklyn Bridge. Discover the story of the bridge from dream to completion with plans, photographs, documents, antique postcards and more in this exhibit.
